Minutes of the Meeting of the 1st Empowered Committee on Integrated Cluster Action Plan for the State of Andhra Pradesh under the National Rurban Mission (NRuM) 25th July 2016

The first Empowered Committee meeting was held on 25.07.2016, under the chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Rural Development, for review and approval of the Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs) submitted by the States of Andhra Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, under NRuM. The detailed agenda for the meeting is placed in Flag 'X'.

The summary of the approvals and observations is placed below:

A. Andhra Pradesh

The State has submitted 5 ICAPs for the 5 approved clusters under NRuM phase 1, duly approved by Chief Secretary of the State.



III. Key Action Points for the State of Andhra Pradesh

- 1. In accordance with the above approval, the CGF for non-tribal clusters of Singarayakonda has been reduced from Rs 33.44 crores to Rs 30.00 crores & Kambadur from Rs 30.13 crores to 30.00 crores respectively. The CGF for tribal cluster of Arakku has been capped at 15.00 crores.
- 2. Accordingly, the State of Andhra Pradesh is advised to rework on the additional resources to be converged to meet this reduction in CGF for the above mentioned clusters and submit a revised ICAP during the DPR submission.

B. Chhattisgarh

The State has submitted 4 ICAPs for the 4 approved clusters under NRuM phase 1, duly approved by Chief Secretary of the State.

III. Key Action Points for the State of Chhattisgarh

1. In accordance with the above approval, the CGF for non-tribal clusters of Loharsi cluster has been reduced from Rs 35.79 crores to Rs 30.00 crores and for Kunda cluster from Rs 47.48 crores to Rs 30.00 crores. The CGF for tribal clusters of Madpal & Murmunda has been capped at Rs 15.00 crores from the proposed Rs 30.41 crores and Rs 34.04 crores respectively. The State of Chattisgarh is advised to rework on the additional resources to

be converged to meet this deduction in CGF and submit a revised ICAP during the DPR submission. A letter from the State to ensure the increased convergence amount as indicated should be obtained.

2. Thrust should be given on utilization of non-renewable energy for rural electrification/street lighting. The representative from Ministry of Power stated that the Ministry of Power has saturated the Bastar district through provision of solar electricity. The state of Chhatisgarh is advised to explore this.

General comments pertaining to both States:

- The State Gap Fund, with a budget of Rs 1975.00 crores, earmarked specially to facilitate convergence for rural development programs in the State of Andhra Pradesh, from where a large share of the convergence amount has been identified for the clusters, was highly appreciated by the Committee. It was recommended that all States may replicate the same.
- 2. Large share of CGF has been allotted for construction of village streets with drains in both the States. The same was justified by the State, stating reasons of cost intensity. However, in order to create a identity for the Mission, the States are advised to reallocate part of the CGF towards development of a thematic component in the cluster or any particular innovation.
- 3. Advisory will be issued to all the States to allot at-least 30% of the CGF amount for investment in innovative/thematic projects in the clusters.
- 4. Commitments from the various Ministries will be obtained on the convergence amount required, category wise. The category wise investment required is summarized in Annexure II.
- 5. AS&FA made a pertinent observation that an output outcome framework be developed wherein the outputs achieved under the Mission could be monitored through a dynamic MIS system to be developed by the Ministry.

Observations from Representatives of other Ministries:

- i. The representative from the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas committed that all Rurban clusters will be saturated with LPG Gas connections during the Mission period.
- ii. The representative from the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship committed that priority will be given to the Rurban Clusters in implementing various schemes of the Ministry.
- iii. The representative from the Ministry of Education stated that the Rurban Clusters have already been included in the priority list. Both the Ministries will work in tandem to increase the reach and effectiveness of the interventions.
