## Special gram sabha on Rurban mission held at Pakyong

**PAKYONG, September 22:** A special gram sabha on Rurban for Namcheybong Rurban Cluster, which includes four contiguous GPUs Namcheybong, Pakyong, Chalamthang and Pakyong was held at Pakyong GPK conference hall here today. Zilla panchayat member Santosh Gurung was the chief guest. Additional secretaries Roshni Rai and Sarika Pradhan and OSD Subash Dhakal were the resource persons of the gram sabha. Pakyong BAC officials, panchayats of all four GPUs, Rurban officials from Delhi and local public were present. Additional secretary Roshni Rai mentioned the purpose of conducting the special gram sabha is to develop local economic development, enhance basic services, and create well planned Rurban clusters. She said the local gram panchayats and line department officers will be involved in Rurban survey team to work out for the development of the cluster. Sarika Pradhan said the Rurban project is a great



opportunity to develop villages and people should take responsibility and support in every way. She urged all present panchayats and public to support during the three years of the project. Subash Dhakal, the OSD in his address informed about the National Rurban Mission (NRuM), its objectives, resources, time line and integrated cluster action plan. The chief guest in his address thanked the resource persons and the concerned officers for making the panchayats and public aware on Rurban mission. He urged

all the panchayats as well as public to support to make the programme. The State Rural Development department is the nodal agency for the mission and Sarika Pradhan is the nodal officer, it was informed.

Under the mission, every Rurban cluster will be developed as a project comprising components covering training linked to economic activities, developing skills and local entrepreneurship and will provide necessary infrastructure amenities. These projects will be

implemented over a fixed timeframe of three years by integrating and converging the implementation of project components. This will be followed by an operation and maintenance period of ten years.

### NOTIFICATION

In the exercise of the power conferred by Section 3 of the Sikkim Allotment of House Sites and Construction of Building (Regulation and Control) Act 1985, the State Government hereby declares the following area as a notified Planning Area for the purpose of the RURBAN cluster development at Namcheybong, East Sikkim.

#### Development Area

The development area for Namcheybong Cluster includes the following Gram Panchayat Units/Wards:

Chalamthang

Pachey Samsing

Namcheybong

Pakyong

#### Planning Area

NORTH	Starting from Nim Khola - Rani Khola confluence (88°33' 22.71" E, 27°15' 37.73" N) in the North West, the northern boundary of the Namchebong Rurban Cluster follows Ranikhola upstream upto Rani Khola - Namphay Khola (Adheri Khola) confluence. From the confluence, it follows Namphay Khola upstream along the northern boundary of Plot Nos: 1079, 1084 and 1085 of Mr. Zangpo Bhutia in Samsing revenue block upto Gufa. From Gufa, it is bound by the forest boundary of the Tokchi Reserve Forest in the North East upto Plot No: 1233, within which is Tokchi Primary School (88°38' 18.51" E, 27°14' 37.31" N).
EAST	From Tokchi Primary School, the planning area enfolds the eastern boundary of Plot No. 1233, which then follows a south west direction along the Ridge upto Lassithang Gumpa dara turning. Excluding the Gumpa, it crosses Pakyong-Machong road, and runs northwards upto Plot No: 1523. From this point, the boundary, runs westward and then northward direction- along the western boundary of Plot Nos: 1521, 1515, 1513, 1512, 1508, 1507, 1503, 1501, 1500, 1499, 1497, 1486, 1482 and 1480 until it meets the ward boundary of the 1/Ganchung ward of 7/Taza GP. The boundary follows the ward boundary of Ganchung ward which extends in north direction, crosses Pakyong-Machong road, extends further northwards until it meets Pachey-Phirpherey road after which it follows this road towards Pachey till the Pachey Power Substation. Including the Power-substation, the planning area boundary follows the ridge towards south upto Plot No: 609. Turning along the southern boundary of Plot no 609, the boundary follows a west direction along the southern boundary of Plot Nos: 571, 570, 568, 557, 556, 554, 550, 549, 548, 547, 538, 537, 533, and then along the eastern boundary of Plot Nos:

	527, 526 up to 525 or the RMDD complex. From the RDD Dara, it follows the unmetalled road towards the south, which passes by the house of Mr Hemendra Adikari. Excluding the above house, the boundary runs southward along the ridge, including a cluster of houses of Basnet Gaon on the ridge upto new Pakyong-Dugalakha by-pass road. It crosses the bypass road and follows a CC footpath along Goley Dara, crossing Pakyong -Mamring road, Dugalakha JHS, (including Dugalakha JHS playground) following the footpath further south along the ridge, to Barpipal Dara, (excluding the house of Mr Netra Prasad Adhikari) till it reaches Pachey Khola. The boundary further follows in south direction along Pachey Khola downstream till it meets Rangpo Khola south of Rorathang Bazar (88°36' 41.29" E, 27°11' 39.11" N).
SOUTH	The southern boundary of the Namchebong Rurban Cluster runs along Rangpo Khola from Rangpo khola/Pachey Khola- confluence westwards till it meets Kali Khola confluence (88°35' 58.67" E, 27°11' 30.52" N).
WEST	From the confluence of Kalikhola/Rangpo Khola, the boundary of Namcheybong Rurban Cluster runs along Kali Khola upstream upto Plot No: 378 of Lossing revenue block. Following the western boundaries of Plot Nos: 378 and 42, crossing the Lossing road, it follows the western boundaries of Plot Nos: 38 and 05 of Loring revenue block and the western boundary of Plot Nos: 510 and 508 of Dikling revenue block (includes Dikling Monastery) and follows the footpath along the western boundary of Plot Nos: 494, 493, 492 and 460. Leaving the footpath here, it follows the boundaries of Plot Nos: 467, 461 460, 459, 458, crosses PMGSY road, again follows Plot Nos: 119, 108, 107, 105, 47/1141, 45, 43, 41, 39, 37, 02 and 04 of Dikling revenue block. Further northwards, it follows Damlakha ridge (which is the block boundary between Kartok and East Pandam revenue blocks) upto Kartok reserve forest boundary. The planning area is bound by Kartok Reserve Forest upto the northern boundary of Plot no: 241 of the Namchebong revenue block, after which, it follows the western boundary of Plot No: 241, 153, 128, and 126 downstream along Nim Khola upto its junction with Rani Khola (88°33' 22.71" E, 27°15' 37.73" N).

# DRAFT SLEC RESOLUTION

## MEETING OF THE STATE LEVEL EMPOWERED COMMITTEE FOR SHYAMA PRASAD MUKHERJEE RURBAN MISSION FOR NAMCHEYBONG RURBAN CLUSTER

### MINUTES OF THE MEETING

The State Level Empowered Committee meeting, on Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Rurban Mission chaired by the Chief Secretary, Government of Sikkim was held at the Conference hall of the Home Department on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2016. The meeting was attended by the following SLEC members.

In addition to the above, officers from various line departments were also present at the meeting.

#### The objectives of the meeting:

- To apprise the State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC) about the Integrated Cluster Action Plan (ICAP) for Namcheybong Rurban Cluster that had been prepared by the State Nodal Agency.
- To finalize on convergence of various state and Central schemes for the project
- To seek approval and recommendation of the ICAP by the SLEC for submission to the Ministry.

#### Presentation on ICAP by Mrs. Sarika Pradhan: (Nodal Officer – Rurban Mission)

Mrs Sarika Pradhan (Additional Secretary cum Nodal Officer- Rurban Mission) presented the house with a power point presentation on the ICAP for Namcheybong Rurban Cluster. Introducing the house about the Mission and its objectives, she also briefed the house about the guidelines and the criteria provided by the Ministry and the reasons for selection of Namcheybong Cluster as the Phase 1 Rurban Cluster for Sikkim. She also highlighted the sequence of steps which were followed on the preparation of the ICAP. She then elaborated on the deficiency analysis of the cluster and various needs identified during the survey on a sequential manner.

#### • Skill Development Training:

a)The training on skills like carpet weaving, bamboo weaving, traditional wood carving, pottery making, tourism and hospitality, mobile and computer repairing, masonry, carpenter, painter, plumber etc to be imparted to approximately 700 youth over the period of three yrs through convergence with DDU-GJY and NRLM.

b)1500 farmers to be trained in various aspects of organic farming, agro processing, beekeeping, fisheries and dairy farming- training to be taken up under CGF.

**Comments:** The training on use of power tiller for the rural farmers was also suggested by JD East – Agriculture Dept.

#### • Agri Service and Processing:

a) She highlighted the need to sow fodders like Berseem, Guatemala to meet the scarcity of fodder during November to April. The strengthening of infrastructures on Animal Husbandry and Veterinary services, the need of 2 Milk collection centers and 1 RMC in the area as identified in the survey were proposed to be carried out under PMFBY. The damage of crops due to natural calamities, hailstones and the wild animals were reported significantly in the area and hence the need to insure the crops through PMFBY was also placed in the meeting.

**Comments:** The Commissioner cum Secretary, Agriculture Department suggested that the insurance of crops as proposed in the ICAP be incorporated in their DIP.

b) Creation of 50 water harvesting tanks of 20,000 litres each, strengthening and creation of 500 meter MIC to meet the irrigation requirement from November to April were proposed to be covered through PMKSY and MGNREGS.

c) The deficiency of input materials, organizational skills, post harvest value chain and market support in Organic farming, as identified in the area was proposed to be covered under MOVCD, PMKVY and MGNREGS.

• **Digital Literacy and Citizens Service Centre:** One computer training infrastructure and one CSC for the whole cluster - at the proposed Rurban Complex at Pakyong, to be covered under CGF / NoFN was also proposed in the presentation.

#### • Drinking Water:

a)Augmentation/repair and replacement of existing water system to the tune of 1 Cr proposed from CGF.

b) Two new comprehensive DW project to cater additional 1600 HH in 4 GPU's meeting the demand surplus on sustainable basis was proposed from to be met from NEC/NLCPR

**Comments:** Principal Secretary HRDD stated that the drinking water was indeed a major problem of the present times and therefore the alternative measures like distribution through water tanks also to be considered for future.

# SLEC RESOLUTION

Special Secretary DEPR and NECA also suggested to explore the option of Dhara Vikash works to support the drinking water problems of the area. This however was ruled out due to non suitability of recharge area in the region.

- **Sanitation:** There was a lack of public convenience (Public toilets) at the Bus and Taxi stand of Pakyong, which is therefore proposed to be covered under SBM/CGF.
- **Solid & Liquid Waste Management:** To further strengthen to solid waste collection machinery and to meet the deficiency of treatment facility at cluster level, 2 pick up vans for garbage collection from the CGF and 2 Resource Recovery Centre in the Cluster from SBM was also proposed.
- **Access to village streets and drains:**  
The gap of about 25 Kms of the CC footpath in 34 stretches of the cluster to be taken up under MGNREGS/14<sup>th</sup> FC and CGF. 25 JTW requirements to be covered under NEC/NABARD, and around 17 km of drains in 13 stretches of cluster as identified are proposed to be taken up under NHIDG/PMGSY.
- **Village Street Lights:** The need for repair of 64 street lights and installation of additional 288 street lights in 24 wards was consented by Additional CE, Power Department to be covered under DDU GJY
- **Health:** New electric wiring for Pakyong PHC and a boundary wall for the Pakyong PHC to be taken up under NHM was discussed and consented by the Director NHM. Further, the requirement of one Mobile Medical Unit of befitting size was proposed to be procured under CSR.
- **Education:** The proposal for upgradation of two schools of Pachey SS and Raigaon JHS in the ICAP was suggested to be withdrawn from the ICAP by Principal Secretary HRDD as it does not conform to the guidelines of RMSA. The Chief Secretary, Govt of Sikkim also suggested to focus more on strengthening of existing infrastructures than to propose upgradation. Therefore, only following works under education sector, were recommended stand in the ICAP- 1 ICDS centre as proposed to be covered under MGNREGS/ ICDS. The requirement of drinking water facility in 4 school to be taken up under NRDWP/ CGF. Inadequate toilet facility in 2 schools and fencing requirement for 3 schools to be taken up by HRDD under RMSA and SSA.
- **Inter Village Road Connectivity:** More arterial roads to be connected under PMGSY, bridge across Ranikhola at 32<sup>nd</sup> mile to connect to the PMGSY road at Namcheybong under PMGSY/PWD were also proposed in the ICAP presentation.
- **LPG Connection:** The need to provide additional LPG Connection to BPL household under PMUY and appointment of LPG distributor at Pakyong Bazaar were also identified as the needs in the ICAP.
- **Infrastructure:** A Rurban Complex that will house the cluster administration and line departments for better coordination and easy access is proposed to be covered under CGF. The Rurban Complex will also house a computer training and Skill development.

## Remarks by Secretary RMDD:

Secretary RMDD in his remarks informed the house about the phase II Rurban Cluster for which Namthang Cluster of South Sikkim had been selected. He also solicited the support and cooperation of all the SLEC members and various line departments in finalization of ICAP and convergence of various schemes. He finally apprised the Chief Secretary for his guidance and support for successful implementation of the scheme.

## Concluding Remarks by Chief Secretary:

Chief Secretary before giving his concluding remark apprised the members of the SLEC for their opinion on the project. He also appreciated the idea of having a Rurban Complex in the cluster which he said would help to ease many public related works. He also suggested to incorporate a conference hall in the Rurban Complex which was felt necessary in the cluster.

The meeting concluded with vote of thanks by Deputy Secretary (Rurban)
