The Shyama Prasad Mukherji Rurban Mission or the National Rurban Mission (NRuM) was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on February 21, 2016 with an outlay of Rs.5142.08 crores. This is a unique programme, designed to deliver catalytic interventions to rural areas on the threshold of growth. 300 Rurban clusters with thematic economic growth points, are being developed across the country under this Mission, with a funding support of upto 30% of the estimated investment for each Ruran cluster, given as Critical Gap Funding (CGF), while 70% of the funds is mobilized by the States through convergence with synergic State and Central programmes as well as private investment and institutional funding. Upon being re-classified as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, the CGF is now shared between the Centre and the State in a ratio of 60:40 for Plain area States and 90:10 for Himalayan and NE States. The following points which reflect the progress of the Mission, is being highlighted for your understanding:

A. Progress of the Mission at the National Level

The Mission has progressed at a fast pace since the launch in 2016, with Rs.957 crores of Central Share of CGF, Rs.387 crores as corresponding State share and Rs. 88.20 crores of Administrative Funding, released to 29 States and 4 Union Territories over the last two financial years.

2. Till date, of the mandated 300 clusters, 276 clusters have been identified and approved across the country. Further, through intense engagements with the States, 151 Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs), which are the blue prints of investment for each cluster, have been approved for 29 States and one UT of Dadra & Nagar Haveli.

3. Rs.15,630 crores of investment has been estimated in the first 151 ICAPs, to be met by the funds mobilized through Convergence as well as the Central and State share of CGF. Of the total investment proposed, nearly 78% is targeted towards saturation of Economic and Basic Amenities. Various Thematic Areas have been identified for saturation of Economic Amenities, such as Agri Services and Processing, followed by Skill development to promote Small and Medium Scale Enterprises and Tourism.

4. The works in the clusters in the areas identified are ongoing and nearly Rs.1500 crores of expenditure has been incurred on the ground till date. In this, the State of Chhattisgarh is leading with the largest expenditure incurred on the ground in the Rurban clusters, followed by Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh.

B. Progress of the Mission in Bihar and interventions requested

- 1. The State of Bihar has been allocated 11 clusters under this Mission over three Phases. The Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs) for Phase 1 has been submitted by the State and approved by the Ministry and Rs 21.60 crores has been released to the State under this Mission as Central Share apart from administrative funding for Phase 1 and 2 clusters. (Please refer to Status Sheet for Bihar under NRuM for details of the clusters and the work done so far).
- 2. The State of Bihar needs to improve pace and performance under this Mission and the following issues are being brought to your notice for your intervention:
 - a. Against the Rs 21.60 crores released to the State, the corresponding State share of Rs 14.40 crores is yet to be released by the State.

b. The DPRs of Phase-I are yet to submitted, these needs to be submitted to Ministry earliest

c. Works are yet to begin on the ground under Phase 1 and the utilization of Critical Gap Funds is yet to commence.

d. The ICAPs of Phase-2 are yet to be submitted, these need to be submitted to Ministry by February, 2018.

e. The list of Phase 3 clusters is yet to be submitted to the Ministry. This needs to be submitted at the earliest to the Ministry, which otherwise would be reallocated to another State upon non submission within March 31st, 2018.

The Mission, if implemented well, will see almost Rs.400 crores of investment only under Phase 1 clusters and an additional Rs.800 crores when Phases 2 & 3 are taken up. This will also result in 11 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of thematic economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering 26 GPs, which would be also be ODF, Zero Waste, Skilled and saturated with LPG connections and other key basic amenities.

Hence, your timely intervention for the issues summarised in 2 (a) to (e) in B above, would ensure success of the Mission and will lead to the intended outcome in your State at the earliest.



- 2. Chhattisgarh has been doing good work under this Mission as per the tenets of the framework of implementation. However the following issues are being brought to your notice for your intervention:
 - a. The ICAPs of Phase-3 are yet to be submitted, these need to be submitted to Ministry by February, 2018.
 - b. The State has to release remaining state share amount against the release of 2nd installment of Central Share under Phase-II.

The Mission, if implemented well, will see almost Rs.500 crores of investment only under Phase 1 clusters and an additional Rs 1100 crores when Phases 2 & 3 are taken up. This will also result in 18 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of thematic economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering 174 GPs, which would be also be ODF, Zero Waste, Skilled and saturated with LPG connections and other key basic amenities.

Hence, your timely intervention for the issues summarised in 2(a) and (b) in B above, would ensure success of the Mission and will lead to the intended outcome in your State at the earliest.

The Shyama Prasad Mukherji Rurban Mission or the National Rurban Mission (NRuM) was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on February 21, 2016 with an outlay of Rs.5142.08 crores. This is a unique programme, designed to deliver catalytic interventions to rural areas on the threshold of growth. 300 Rurban clusters with thematic economic growth points, are being developed across the country under this Mission, with a funding support of upto 30% of the estimated investment for each Rurban cluster, given as Critical Gap Funding (CGF), while 70% of the funds is mobilized by the States through convergence with synergic State and Central programmes as well as private investment and institutional funding. Upon being re-classified as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, the CGF is now shared between the Centre and the State in a ratio of 60:40 for Plain area States and 90:10 for Himalayan and NE States. The following points which reflect the progress of the Mission, is being highlighted for your understanding:

A. Progress of the Mission at the National Level

1. The Mission has progressed at a fast pace since the launch in 2016, with Rs.957 crores of Central Share of CGF, Rs.387 crores as corresponding State share and Rs.88.20 crores of Administrative Funding, released to 29 States and 4 Union Territories over the last two financial years.

2. Till date, of the mandated 300 clusters, 276 clusters have been identified and approved across the country. Further, through intense engagements with the States, 151 Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs), which are the blue prints of investment for each cluster, have been approved for 29 States and one UT of Dadra & Nagar Haveli.

- 3. Rs.15,630 crores of investment has been estimated in the first 151 ICAPs, to be met by the funds mobilized through Convergence as well as the Central and State share of CGF. Of the total investment proposed, nearly 78% is targeted towards saturation of Economic and Basic Amenities. Various Thematic Areas have been identified for saturation of Economic Amenities, such as Agri Services and Processing, followed by Skill development to promote Small and Medium Scale Enterprises and Tourism.
- 4. The works in the clusters in the areas identified are ongoing and nearly Rs.1500 crores of expenditure has been incurred on the ground till date. In this, the State of Chhattisgarh is leading with the largest expenditure incurred on the ground in the Rurban clusters, followed by Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh.

Progress of the Mission in Odisha and interventions requested

- 1. The State of Odisha has been allocated 14 clusters under this Mission over three Phases. The Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs) for Phase 1 & Phase II have been submitted by the State and approved by the Ministry and Rs.62.10 crores has been released to the State under this Mission as Central Share apart from administrative funding for Phase 1 and 2 clusters. (Please refer to Status Sheet for Odisha under NRuM for details of the clusters and the work done so far).
- 2. Odisha has been doing good work under this Mission as per the tenets of the framework of implementation. However the following issues are being brought to your notice for your intervention:
 - a) Works under Phase 1 and the utilization of Critical Gap Funds is slow.
 - b) The ICAPs of Phase-3 are yet to be submitted, these need to be submitted to Ministry by February, 2018.

The Mission, if implemented well, will see almost Rs.500 crores of investment only under Phase 1 clusters and an additional Rs. 800 crores when Phases 2 & 3 are taken up. This will also result in 14 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of thematic economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering 63 GPs, which would be also be ODF, Zero Waste, Skilled and saturated with LPG connections and other key basic amenities.

Hence, your timely intervention for speed in implementation would ensure success of the Mission and will lead to the intended outcome in your State at the earliest.
