The Shyama Prasad Mukherji Rurban Mission or the National Rurban Mission (NRuM) was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on February 21, 2016 with an outlay of Rs.5142.08 crores. This is a unique programme, designed to deliver catalytic interventions to rural areas on the threshold of growth. 300 Rurban clusters with thematic economic growth points, are being developed across the country under this Mission, with a funding support of upto 30% of the estimated investment for each Rurban cluster, given as Critical Gap Funding (CGF), while 70% of the funds is mobilized by the States through convergence with synergic State and Central programmes as well as private investment and institutional funding. Upon being re-classified as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, the CGF is now shared between the Centre and the State in a ratio of 60:40 for Plain area States and 90:10 for Himalayan and NE States. The following points which reflect the progress of the Mission, is being highlighted for your understanding:

A. Progress of the Mission at the National Level

The Mission has progressed at a fast pace since the launch in 2016, with Rs.957 crores of Central Share of CGF, Rs.387 crores as corresponding State share and Rs.88.20 crores of Administrative Funding, released to 29 States and 4 Union Territories over the last two financial years.

Till date, of the mandated 300 clusters, 276 clusters have been identified and approved across the country. Further, through intense engagements with the States, 151 Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs), which are the blue prints of investment for each cluster, have been approved for 29 States and one UT of

Dadra & Nagar Haveli.

3. Rs.15,630 crores of investment has been estimated in the first 151 ICAPs, to be met by the funds mobilized through Convergence as well as the Central and State share of CGF. Of the total investment proposed, nearly 78% is targeted towards saturation of Economic and Basic Amenities. Various Thematic Areas have been identified for saturation of Economic Amenities, such as Agri Services and Processing, followed by Skill development to promote Small and Medium Scale Enterprises and Tourism.

4. The works in the clusters in the areas identified are ongoing and nearly Rs.1500 crores of expenditure has been incurred on the ground till date. In this, the State of Chhattisgarh is leading with the largest expenditure incurred on the ground in the Rurban clusters, followed by Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh.

B. Progress of the Mission in Arunachal Pradesh and interventions requested

- 1. The State of Arunachal Pradesh has been allocated 4 clusters under this Mission over three Phases. The Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs) for Phase 1have been submitted by the State and approved by the Ministry and Rs.4.50 crores has been released to the State under this Mission as Central Share apart from administrative funding for Phase 1 and 2 clusters. (Please refer to Status Sheet for Arunachal Pradesh under NRuM for details of the clusters and the work done so far).
- Arunachal Pradesh has not been performing effectively under this Mission after 2016. In this regard, the following issues are being brought to your notice for your intervention:
 - a) Works under Phase 1 and the utilization of Critical Gap Funds needs to be expedited to achieve 60% utilization at the earliest.

b) The ICAPs of Phase 2 are yet to be submitted, these need to be submitted to Ministry by February, 2018.

c) The matching State share of Rs 0.50 crores, for the CGF released till date needs to be released at the earliest.

The Mission, if implemented well, will see almost Rs.50 crores of investment only under Phase 1 clusters and an additional Rs 150 crores when Phases 2 & 3 are taken up. This will also result in 4 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of thematic economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering 20 GPs, which would be also be ODF. Zero Waste, Skilled and saturated with LPG connections and other key basic amenities.

Hence, your timely intervention for the issues summarised in 2(a) to (c) in B above. would ensure success of the Mission and will lead to the intended outcome in your State at the earliest.

B. Progress of the Mission in Assam and interventions requested

- 1. The State of Assam has been allocated 09 clusters under this Mission over Phase 2 & 3. The Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs) for 3 out of 5 clusters under Phase 2 have been submitted by the State and approved by the Ministry and Rs.20.25 crores have been released to the State under this Mission as Central Share apart from administrative funding of Rs.1.75 Crore for Phase 2 clusters. (Please refer to Status Sheet for Assam under NRuM for details of the clusters and the work done so far).
- 2. Assam has participated in this Mission, however further works and submissions under Phase 2&3 are lagging in the State. Following key issues are being brought to your notice for your intervention:
 - a) Against the Rs.20.25 crores released to the State under Phase 2, the corresponding State share of Rs.2.25 crores is yet to be released by the State.
 - b) The DPR for Phase-2 clusters is yet to be submitted, this needs to be approved by the SLEC after which works should commence at the earliest, so that Ministry can release the second installment, upon successful utilization of 60% of the CGF released to the cluster so far.
 - c) The ICAPs for balance 2 clusters of Phase-2 are yet to be submitted. these need to be submitted to Ministry by February, 2018.
 - The Phase 3 clusters details duly approved by SLEC, need to be submitted at the earliest to the Ministry before March 2018, failing which the clusters would be reallocated to another State.

The Mission, if implemented well, will see almost Rs.500 crores of investment only under Phase 2 clusters and an additional Rs 250 crores when Phases 3 is taken up. This will also result in 09 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of thematic economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering around 40 GPs, which would be also be ODF, Zero Waste. Skilled and saturated with LPG connections and other key basic amenities.

Hence, your timely intervention for the issues summarized in 2(a) to (d) in B above, would ensure success of the Mission and will lead to the intended outcome in your State at the earliest. personal regard

- 2. Meghalaya has not been performing as per potential of the State as a forerunner in many other programmes. In this regard, the following issues are being brought to your notice for your intervention:
 - a) Against the Rs.8.10 crores released to the State under Phase-2, the corresponding State share of Rs.0.90 crores is yet to be released by the State to the State RD-Rurban account.

b) Works on the ground under Phase-I is slow and the utilization of Critical Gap Funds has not yet reached the 60% level.

c) The State matching share of Rs 0.90 crores is to be released at the earliest.

The Mission, if implemented well, will see almost Rs150 crores of investment only under Phase I & II clusters and an additional Rs 50 crores when Phase-III is taken up. This will also result in 4 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering more than 50 villages, which would be ODF, Zero Waste, saturated with LPG connections and with skilled manpower in every household.

Hence, your timely intervention for the issues summarised in 2(a) to (c) in B above, would ensure success of the Mission and will lead to the intended outcome in your State at the earliest.



The Shyama Prasad Mukherji Rurban Mission or the National Rurban Mission (NRuM) was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on February 21, 2016 with an outlay of Rs.5142.08 crores. This is a unique programme, designed to deliver catalytic interventions to rural areas on the threshold of growth. 300 Rurban clusters with thematic economic growth points, are being developed across the country under this Mission, with a funding support of upto 30% of the estimated investment for each Rurban cluster, given as Critical Gap Funding (CGF), while 70% of the funds is mobilized by the States through convergence with synergic State and Central programmes as well as private investment and institutional funding. Upon being re-classified as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, the CGF is now shared between the Centre and the State in a ratio of 60:40 for Plain area States and 90:10 for Himalayan and NE States. The following points which reflect the progress of the Mission, is being highlighted for your understanding:

In this, the State of Chhattisgarh is leading with the largest expenditure incurred on the ground in the Rurban clusters, followed by Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh.

This will also result in 2 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of thematic economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering 26 GPs, which would be also be ODF, Zero Waste, Skilled and saturated with LPG connections and other key basic amenities.



The Shyama Prasad Mukherji Rurban Mission or the National Rurban Mission (NRuM) was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on February 21, 2016 with an outlay of Rs.5142.08 crores. This is a unique programme, designed to deliver catalytic interventions to rural areas on the threshold of growth. 300 Rurban clusters with thematic economic growth points, are being developed across the country under this Mission, with a funding support of upto 30% of the estimated investment for each Rurban cluster, given as Critical Gap Funding (CGF), while 70% of the funds is mobilized by the States through convergence with synergic State and Central programmes as well as private investment and institutional funding. Upon being re-classified as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, the CGF is now shared between the Centre and the State in a ratio of 60:40 for Plain area States and 90:10 for Himalayan and NE States. The following points which reflect the progress of the Mission, is being highlighted for your understanding:

A. Progress of the Mission at the National Level

1. The Mission has progressed at a fast pace since the launch in 2016, with Rs.957 crores of Central Share of CGF, Rs.387 crores as corresponding State share and Rs.88.20 crores of Administrative Funding, released to 29 States and 4 Union Territories over the last two financial years.

2. Till date, of the mandated 300 clusters, 276 clusters have been identified and approved across the country. Further, through intense engagements with the States, 151 Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs), which are the blue prints of investment for each cluster, have been approved for 29 States and one UT of

Dadra & Nagar Haveli.

3. Rs.15,630 crores of investment has been estimated in the first 151 ICAPs, to be met by the funds mobilized through Convergence as well as the Central and State share of CGF. Of the total investment proposed, nearly 78% is targeted towards saturation of Economic and Basic Amenities. Various Thematic Areas have been identified for saturation of Economic Amenities, such as Agri Services and Processing, followed by Skill development to promote Small and Medium Scale Enterprises and Tourism.

4. The works in the clusters in the areas identified are ongoing and nearly Rs.1500 crores of expenditure has been incurred on the ground till date. In this, the State of Chhattisgarh is leading with the largest expenditure incurred on the ground in the Rurban clusters, followed by Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Andhra

Pradesh.

B. Progress of the Mission in Tripura and interventions requested

- Tripura has been allocated 7 clusters in all under three Phases of the Mission, 2 clusters under Phase-I, 3 clusters under Phase-II and 2 clusters under Phase-III. The State has submitted the Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs) for Phase-I, which were approved by the Ministry and Rs 44.55 crores has been released to the State under this Mission apart from administrative funding of Rs 1.75 crores for Phase-I and II clusters, as Central Share. (Please refer to Status Sheet for Tripura under NRuM for details of the clusters and the work done so far)
- Tripura has been performing slowly under this Mission as per the tenets of the framework of implementation. However the following issues are being brought to your notice for your intervention:
 - a) The balance State Share of Rs.5.00 crores needs to be released at the earliest to the State RD - Rurban account.
 - b) Further, the release of funds from the relevant departments for the convergence amounts projected to meet the total investment in the clusters needs to be expedited.
 - c) Works on the ground under Phase-I and the utilization of Critical Gap Funds needs to be expedited to reach the 60% utilization at the earliest.
 - d) The DPRs of Phase-il are yet to be submitted, these need to be submitted to Ministry by February, 2018.
 - The list of Phase 3 clusters is yet to be submitted to the Ministry. This needs to be submitted at the earliest to the Ministry, which otherwise would be reallocated to another State upon nonsubmission within March 31, 2018.

The Mission, if implemented well, will see almost Rs.200 crores of investment only under Phase 1 clusters and an additional Rs.150 crores when Phases-II &III are taken up. This will also result in 7 Rurban clusters, which would be centers of economic growth across the State in rural areas, covering more than 35 GPs, which would be ODF. Zero Waste, saturated with LPG connections and with skilled manpower in every household.

Hence, your timely intervention for the issues summarised in 2(a) to (e) above. would ensure success of the Mission and will lead to the intended outcome in your State at the earliest. with best wishes,
